## **Leaders are Readers Program**

**Snack Program** - Sponsor classroom snacks for a year. Teachers also send packs of snacks home with students occasionally when they become aware of food insecurity. *Cost: \$9,000 (\$500/class, 18 classrooms)*

**Kona Ice** - Snow-cones for all students and staff on the last day of school has become a beloved tradition. Cost = \$500

## **No Cost Options to Support Read Students**

**Mentorship Program** - The CARE Team (pupil services team) will generate a list of students & their interests to partner mentors with mentees. Activities could include eating lunch together, reading, general homework support, playing basketball or soccer, chess or doing puzzles, etc.

**Letters of Encouragement during State Testing Season** - Students in 3rd, 4th, & 5th grade take the Forward Exam to demonstrate their knowledge across subject areas. This time can be stressful for students because of the highly structured, computer-based environment throughout the testing window. In an effort to show our support & make sure they know we believe in them, teachers & families write letters of encouragement, make posters, etc. Your employee volunteers could do this, too!

**Classroom Support** - Literacy & Math blocks, additional adult in the room, assisting the teacher by circulating, helping students with materials, staying engaged & on pace with the teacher, if asked/willing, facilitate small group activities, Math Work Places are math games that can be played in small groups. Literacy Footprints are a guided reading activity where the adult has a script card to lead the activity with 1-2 students.

Recess & Lunchroom Supervision – Volunteer to supervise and engage with students

**Morning Greeters** - Bring your coffee, and give kids a positive start to the day! – 7:30-7:45am every day

**Join the Walking School Bus** - Staff members walk a route similar to how a school bus would, with stops along the way. 7:00am-7:30am, two routes to choose from. Walk with students, start their day with a smile. Carry your coffee with you!

**Clerical Tasks** - Non-student-contact activities good for individuals who are immunocompromised, can include tasks that can be taken off-site & returned when completed)

Reminder: All opportunities that include direct contact with students will require a background check through the Oshkosh Area School District.
